

of section 90, 91, 92, 93, 94, 95, 96, 97, 98 of this Article, or both fine and forfeiture, in the discretion of the justice of the peace trying the same. Provided, that the party feeling aggrieved, shall have the right of appeal as in other cases before justices of the peace, and provided further, that in case of appeal the person appealing shall give to the State of Maryland, a good and sufficient bond covering double the amount of fine or forfeiture in case of forfeit, so as to secure to the State the amount of fine and forfeiture in case he does not prosecute his appeal with effect.

“Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.”
