defraying the necessary expenses of said commission, the Legislative appropriation for the porpose hoving proven insufficient."

Which was read a first time.

Also, favorably,

House bill, No. 49, entitled "An Act to appropriate the sum of two thousand one hundred and twelve dollars and ninety-nine cents, out of the public school funds, to reimburse Garrett county for an instalment of State school tax withheld from said county, in the year 1903, and also, to authorize and direct the Comptroller to apportion to said county the instalment known as the "March Iustalment of the State School Tax for the year 1904," said instalment being the apportionment made to said Garrett county, on the 15th day of March in each year."

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Collins from Committe on Claims reported favorably the following order,
