Whereas the citizens of the State of Maryland and of the city of Baltimore propose to begin at once the rehabilitating of their stricken city with a view to increasing its usefulness as a seaport and place of export and import, and to that end are making every effort in their power,

Now, therefore, the General Assembly of the State of Maryland do hereby request the representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States of America to make every effort in their power to secure from the Federal Government a substantial appropriation for the immediate improvement of the harbor of Baltimore city.

And it is ordered that a copy of this resolution be sent to each and every representative of this State in the Congress of the United States of America.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Federal Relations.
