the Senate and five on the part of the House, who together with the Board of Public Works, shall be requested to immediately confer with the Mayor of Baltimore city for the purpose of determining what assistance the State of Maryland can render to the city to relieve the immediate distress caused by the disastrous fire, and that said committee be requested to meet at once and report back to the Legislature forthwith.

We have named on the part of the House, Messrs. Goslin, Morrison, Moore, Wells and Henkel.
