Mr. Johston, from the Judiciary Committee reported favorably,

House bill, File No. 18, entitled "An Act to require all railroad companies and corporations, and all persons running or operating cars or coaches by steam on any railroad line or track in the State of Maryland, for the transportation of passengers, to provide separate cars or coaches for white and colored passengers, without any difference or discrimination in the quality of, or accommodation in such cars or coaches."

Which was read a first time.

Also favorably,

House bill, File No. 33, entitled "An Act to provide for separate accommodations of white and colored passengers in the sitting, sleeping and eating apartments of all steamboats plying in the waters within the jurisdiction of the State of Maryland without any difference in discrimination in the quality and convenience of accommodation."
