Which was adopted, read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Gill, from the Committee on Printing reported unfavorably the following order,

Whereas, Under Article 78, Code Public Laws, the State Printers have been required to print a certain number of bills, which number has been found to be inadequate to the wants of the former Legislature; and,

Whereas, The increase in the number of members of the present House, will tend largely to increase this deficiency, it is ordered that W. J. C. Dulany & Co., State Printers, be authorized and directed to print 100 additional copies of all bills they are now required to print under the present contract, the same to be paid for at the rate provided for in Article 78, and the amount to be taken out of the appropriation for State Printing for the session of 1904.

Which unfavorable report was adopted.
