and re enact with amendments section 2, Article 35, Code of Public General Laws, as repealed and reenacted by Act 1902, chapter 495, title 'Evidence,' sub-title 'Competency of Witnesses.'"

Mr. Linthicum offered the following proposed amendments:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amendment to follow at the end of the second section.

"Provided however, the provisions of this Act shall not apply to cases now pending in any of the Courts of this State, nor in anywise affect the present rights and privileges of litigants therein."

Which were adopted.

Mr. Collins, as Chairman of the Committee of the whole, made the report that the amendments were adopted.

The bill, as amended, was ordered re-engrossed for a third reading, and to be placed on the third reading file.
