Senate bill, File No. 118, entitled "An Act to repeal section 137 to 142 D, both inclusive, of Article 3 of the Public Local Laws, title 'Baltimore County,' sub-title 'Justice of the Peace and Constables;' see chapter 147 Acts of 1900, to add new sections as '142 E, etc.'"

Which was read the first time and referred to the Baltimore county delegation.
