

ceedings, as required by said Revised Statutes, that the Joint Assembly shall then proceed to chose by a *viva voce* vote of each member present who receives a majority of all the votes of the Joint Assembly, a majority of all the members elected to both Houses, being present and voting, shall be declared duly elected; also, that if no person shall receive such majority on that day, in Joint Assembly, then the Joint Assembly shall meet at 12 o'clock, meridian, of each day succeeding, during the Session of the Legislature, and shall take at least one vote until such Senator is elected.
