Resolved, By the Frederick Avenue Improvement Association; that we, the members of said association, do most earnestly request the Members of the present House of Delegates and the Senate of Maryland, to use all honorable means to protest against the repeal of the bill known as the "Foutz Annexation Act." Said bill is a meritorious one, having been passed at the last session of the Legislature to construe in particular the full meaning and intent of the original Annexation Act of 1888. The said Foutz Bill has recently been decided by the Court of Appeals of Maryland as being Constitutional, which decision frees us from any further law suits or litigation, and places us in a position, whereby we know that we can safely improve and advance our property in said annex territory without any further litigation or contention.
