appropriated sufficient money to pay the whole cost of the service of the militia who were called out at the time of said fire for service in or near the burnt district of Baltimore. The payment of the militia shall be made in the usual manner, but the intent of this Act is that the total amount paid to them for their services shall be deducted from two hundred and fifty thousand dollars herein appropriated.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Which was adopted, read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
