HOUSE OF DELEGATES, March 1, 1904.

The following Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, originating in the House of Delegates, were presented to the Governor for his approval this day at 11.30 o'clock, a. m.

Chapter 18. "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments chapter 93 entitled 'An Act to add to the power of the Mayor and Council of Takoma Park.'"

Chapter 19. "An Act to prohibit the issuing of licenses to sell spirituous or fermented liquors in the village of Point of Rocks, in Frederick county, or within two miles thereof in said county."

Chapter 20. "An Act to appropriate the sum of two thousand, one hundred and twelve dollars and ninety nine cents, out of the public school funds to reimburse Garret county for an instalment of State School Tax withheld from said county in the year nineteen hundred and three, and also to authorize and direct the Comptroller to apportion the said county the instalment known as the March instalment of the State
