Senate bill, File No. 39, entitled "An Act to refund to Robert F. Walker, a sum of money paid by him to the State's Attorney for Talbot county and covered into the treasury of the State for bail bond forfeited in the case of the State of Maryland vs. Hayes Bailey."

Which unfavorable report was adopted.

Also favorably,

Senate bill, File No. 70, entitled "An Act to repeal sections 146 A, 146 B, 146 C, 146 D, 146 E and 146 F, of Article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled 'Revenue and Taxes,' as amended by chapter 120 of the Acts of 1896, and by chapter 313 of the Acts of 1898, and by chapter 26 of the Acts of 1902."
