Senate bill, File No. 127, entitled “An Act to provide for the building of a Court House in Somerset county, and to authorize and empower and direct the County Commissioners of Somerset county to borrow money on the credit of the county, for the purpose of building the same, and constructing therein the necessary vaults for the preservation of the records and Court papers of the Orphans’ Court and Circuit Court, the County Commissioners and the Board of School Commissioners, and to issue bonds for the payment of the same, and to levy taxes on the assessable property of said county to redeem such bonds and to pay the interest thereon.”
