1. In section 2, line 3, after the word "purposes," insert the following words:

"Provided, however, that no public service corporation shall be formed for more than one purpose."

2. In section 24, line 2, after the word "State," insert the following words:

"Excepting public service corporations."

3. In section 28, line 11, after the word "expedient," insert the following words:

"Provided that nothing herein contained shall be held or construed to authorize any public service corporation, or any corporation which proposes or performs public service powers or duties, to make any such sale, lease or exchange except to or with another public service corporation of this State, formed for the same general purpose."
