

House bill, File No. 267, entitled "An Act to authorize the Local Boards of Health of the counties and the County Commissioners of the several counties where they exercise such powers to designate and appoint as sub-registrars to issue burial permits, the physician or physicians residing in, attending on or appointed to any college, academy or boarding school, hospital, retreat, asylum, sanatorium or other like place in their respective counties, and to prescribe rules and fix charges for such permits."
