

place in Frederick county, within two miles of the public school house in Urbana district of said county known as Sugar Land, or Mountain School House otherwise known as school No. 6 in election district No. 7 of said county, and also to prohibit the giving away or distributing of such spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer or intoxicating drinks of any kind at or near the place of business of any person within the limits aforesaid.”
