A bill entitled "An Act to repeal sections 19, 20, 21 and 42 of Article 72 of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Oysters,' to repeal and re-enact with amendments, sections 7, 18, 22, 23, 27, 29, 30, 31, 34, 36, 41, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61 and 62 of said Article, and to add to said Article four new sections, to immediately follow section 46, to be designated as 'Sections 46 A, 46 B, 46 C and 46 D.'"
