> STATE LIBRARY, Annapolis, January 4th, 1878.

A. Gassaway, Esq., Secretary of the Senate.

Sir:—In response to the order of the Senate passed on yesterday, I have to state that there are no copies of the Constitution left in the Library, and not sufficient copies of the Code and Supplements to fully furnish the members of the Senate and House.

This deficiency arises from the fact that copies of both Constitution and Code furnished to former Legislatures were not returned to the Library, after the close of the session.

I would respectfully suggest that the course adopted at the last session be now followed, to wit: that I shall furnish 6 copies of the Code and Supplements for the use of the Senate.
