the southern end of South street, in the City of Baltimore, and to make valid to them the title conveyed to them by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, by a deed dated on or about the 24th day of January, in the year 1854.

- "310. The Sheriff of Frederick County shall be entitled to twenty-five cents per day for boarding each prisoner committed to the County Jail."
