On motion by Mr. McLane,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore City Senators to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to amend the charter of the Board of Trade of the City of Baltimore.

On motion by Mr. Garey,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to refund a sum of money to John S. Waters, of Caroline County, for a due proportion of a liquor license procured by him, and made inoperative on account of Local Option.
