others, and most respectfully and earnestly pray the Legislature now in session to extend the privilege of this beneficent enactment to the whole State.

Resolved, That Revs. Samuel V. Leach, Thos. L. Poulson and J. McKendree Reilly be appointed a committee to go to Annapolis and convey these our resolves to the Senate and House of Delegates.
