first day of the second term, after bringing such second suit, the Court shall give a final judgment for the defendant."

To the Honorable,

The President and Members of the Senate.

Gentlemen:—Class legislation is an infliction to which every Legislative Body is subject, and it is especially to be deplored, in that, for at least the time being, and during each agitation of the subject sought to be legislated upon, that particular branch of trade or industry to be affected by the passage of the measure presented are paralyzed, and it
