House bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 202, and to amend and re-enact Section 198, of Article 3, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Baltimore County," sub-title "Wild Fowl,"

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Add to Sec. 198, "and proof that the party charged with shooting ducks in the night time was at or about the place at which a shot was fired, and that he had a gun in his possession on the night in question in the vicinity of, and either prior to, at the time of, or after such firing, and that he was a gunner and sold wild ducks, shall be deemed sufficient evidence to require him to explain satisfactorily such criminating circumstances.
