Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act for the relief of the Baltimore Female College.

On motion by Mr. Gorman,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to empower the Peoples' Passenger Railway Company of Baltimore City to accept subscriptions to its capital stock in personal property or real estate, or in both personal property and real estate.
