Mr. Bannon, from a Select Committee, reported favorably, House bill entitled an Act to authorize and direct the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County, to erect a lock up or guard house in the Fifth District of said county.

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Combs, of St. Mary's, from a Select Committee, reported favorably,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal Article 31, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Crows," so far as the same relates to St. Mary's County.

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Freeman, from the Committee on Temperance, reported favorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to enable the qualified voters of certain Elections Districts of Dorchester County, to determine by ballot whether spirituous or fermented liquors shall be sold in said districts or a license granted for the sale of the same therein.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Finance.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 53, of Article 16, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Prince George's County," under the head of "Collectors," enacted by the Act of 1868, Chapter 330, and to re-enact the same with amendments, and add additional sections thereto,

Was read the third time, and passed by yeas and nays as follows:
