AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

At the end of Section 6, add the words "and provided that this section shall not be construed to apply to such marine railways as are now, or may hereafter be constructed to run into said creek, or to the obstruction and improvements necessarily incident thereto."

Section 9, in line 10, after the word "position," insert "except steamer, vessels or other crafts lying at wharf, discharging cargo or lying at wharf in employment or by consent of owners of such wharf."
