Senate bill entitled an Act supplementary to an Act of 1812, Chapter 159, entitled an Act for founding an University in the city or precincts of Baltimore, by the name of the University of Maryland, and to authorize the regents of the University of Maryland to apply a portion of the property held by said University to the general uses of said University, and to sell said property and apply the proceeds to the general uses of said University,

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 44, of Article 24, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Conveyancing," sub-title "Bills of Sale," and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to amend Article 24, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Conveyancing," by adding a sub-section to Sections 2 and 3, of said Article,

Being upon its second reading,

On motion by Mr. Sulivane,

Said bill was recommitted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, Sections 2, 3, 8, 9, 10 and 11, of Chapter 233, of the Acts of 1874, entitled an Act to establish the Maryland House of Correction,

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
