Mr. Bannon submitted the following amendment :

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Mr. Joyce submitted the following amendments :

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Strike out all after the words "A Bill" in title, and insert the following :

"Entitled an Act to repeal Section 21, of the Acts of the General Assembly, passed at the January, Session, 1876, Chapter 249, entitled 'an Act to provide for the revision of the lists of registered voters in this State,' and to re-enact the same with amendments.

"Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 21, of the Acts of the General Assembly, passed at the January Session, 1876, Chapter 249, entitled 'an Act to provide for the revision of the lists of registered voters in this State,' be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows.

"21. The officers of registration for the several wards of Baltimore City, shall receive a salary of five hundred dollars for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, and an annual salary of five hundred dollars thereafter ; and those for the several counties shall each receive four dollars per day for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of the duties imposed on them by this Article; the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore City, shall receive one cent for every ten words or figures, and *pro rata* for making certified copies of said lists; and the Clerks of the Circuit Courts for the counties shall receive the same compensation for making certified copies of said lists; and the said Clerks shall receive twenty-
