Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal certain sections of Article 47, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to inheritance, and to re-enact said sections with amendments.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, Chapter 437, of the Acts of 1874, and Chapter 405, of the Acts of 1876, relating to the catching of oysters with scoop, scrape or dredge in the waters of Dorchester and Talbot Counties.
