Leave was granted to the Committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries, to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to regulate the catching, and provide for the preservation of fish in the waters of the Potomac and its tributaries.

On motion by Mr. Bannon,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Refrenchment, to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to repeal an Act passed at January Session, 1874, Chapter 200, establishing a State Board of Health.

On motion by Mr. Gorman,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance, to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the Electors of President and Vice-President of the United States, in and for the State of Maryland, their officers and attendants.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations, to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to continue the corporate existence of the Bank of Commerce, in the City of Baltimore, and cancelling two thousand seven hundred shares in the capital stock thereof.
