Leave was granted to Senators Dennis, Franklin and Steiner to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to authorize the Register of Wills of Somerset County to have made a new index of the last wills and testaments recorded in his county.

On motion by Mr. Bannon,

Leave was granted to Senators Bannon, Wilson and Hepbron to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to authorize the Mayor, Counsellor and Aldermen of the City of Annapolis to issue bonds of the said city to pay its debts.
