Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to repeal Section 58, of Article 16, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Chancery," sub-title "Jurisdiction," as amended and re-enacted by Chapter 450, of the Acts passed January Session, 1870, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

On motion by Mr. Hepbron,

Leave was granted to Senators Hepbron, Ford and Combs, of St. Mary's, to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to protect fox-hounds in Kent County whilst engaged in a fox-chase or returning therefrom.

On motion by Mr. Gorman,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to provide for the construction and maintenance of a line of Telegraph from the House of Correction at Jessup's Station, Anne Arundel County, to the Police Headquarters in Baltimore City, from the House of Refuge, in Baltimore County, to the Police Headquarters in Baltimore City, and from the State Penitentiary to the Police Headquarters in Baltimore City.
