Under the head of "Miscellaneous," Section 1, line 3, strike out the words from "out" to the word "appointed," in line 4, inclusive, and insert in lieu thereof the words "until after the election or appointment and qualification of their successors, as in this Act provided.

Sec. 4. Chapter 8, page 23, line 6, after the word "Education," insert "or they may suspend any teacher for incompetency, inefficiency or neglect of duty.

Which was adopted.

Mr. Bannon submitted the following amendment.

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

"Section 1. The State Board of Education shall consist of seven members, one of them to be elected by the qualified voters of each of the following Congressional Districts of this State, at the next election to be held for members of Congress of the United States in November, 1878. One from the first, one from the second, one from the fifth, and one from the sixth, and two members of said Board shall be nominated by the Governor, by and with the consent of the Senate. The members of said Board shall be divided by lot, into two classes of three each, one of the appointees by the Governor, to be in each class, and those of the first class shall go out of office at the expiration of two years, and those of the second class at the end of four years from the first day of January succeeding their election or appointment, or when their successors have been elected and qualified, and after the first election and appointment of members of said Board, the first
