"Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage."

Which was adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was then read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. McLane, from the Committee on Finance, reported favorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to refund to William Howard, of Wicomico County, a sum of money improperly paid into the Treasury.

Which was read the first time.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal Section 64, of Article 75, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to "Pleadings, Practice and Process," as amended by Chapter 283, o the Acts of January Session, 1864, and to re-enact the same so as to read as follows,
