Senate bill entitled an Act to amend Chapter 244, of the Acts of 1872, entitled an Act to authorize the appointment of Weighers of Grain by the Governor, by repealing the 6th Section of said Act, and re-enacting the same in an amended form.

Mr. Miller moved to substitute the bill for the unfavorable report.
