House bill entitled an Act to authorize and direct the County Commissioners of Harford County, to pay to George H. Merritt and M. H. Keene the sum of \$151.58, the same being erroneously paid by said Merritt, &c.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Senators Stump, Peter and Sulivane.
