Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to pay George R. Carter for money erroneously paid on account of reinspection and outrage on tobacco.

On motion by Mr. Joyce,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore City Senators to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to repeal Sections 205, 206 and 212, of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the City of Baltimore, sub-title "Elections," and re-enact the same with amendments.

Mr. Cooper, from the Committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries, reported unfavorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 8, 9, 10, 13, 15, 25, 27 and 35, of Chapter 181, of the Acts of 1874, and Section 5 of said Act as re-enacted with amendments by Chapter 380 of the Acts of 1876, relating to "Oysters," and to add an additional section thereto.

Mr. Sulivane moved to substitute the bill for the unfavorable report.
