The House bill to repeal Sections 1 and 7, of the Act of 1872, Chapter 36, entitled an Act to add a new Article to the Code of Public General Laws, regulating the inspection of Tobacco and to re-enact Section 1, by abolishing the office of Supervisor,

Which had been heretofore referred to the Committee on Agriculture, was changed to the Committee on Inspections.

Senate vill entitled an Act to repeal Chapter 439, of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1874, entitled an Act to regulate the issuing of licenses for the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors in this State, and to re-enact the same with amendments, so as to exempt Montgomery County from the provisions of said Act.
