The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared, and delivered the following bills:

House bill entitled an Act to sanction, confirm and make valid a bequest of five hundred dollars in the will and testament of Mrs. Ursula Wilcoxon, late of Montgomery county, deceased, to the vestry of Prince George's Parish, in said county, and to authorize and empower said vestry to take and receive the same and hold it subject to the provisions of said will.

House bill entitled an Act to give assent of the General Assembly to a devise in the will of Frances Thompson, *feme sole*, late of Washington County, deceased, to the trustees of the Presbyterian Church of Hagerstown, in said county.

House bill entitled an Act to authorize the Commissioners of the Town of Cambridge, Dorchester County, to purchase or condemn a lot and to erect thereon a fire engine house and a market house.
