BY THE SENATE,

March 29, 1878.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We have received your message requesting the Senate to recede from its amendments to House bill entitled an Act making appropriations for the support of the State Government for the fiscal year ending 30th September, 1879, and non-concur therein. We respectfully ask the appointment of a Committee of Conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, to consist of two on the part of the Senate and three on the part of the House.
