has been ruled out of its benefits under the marriage provision of said Act, and asking that she may have special relief for the remainder of her natural life.

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on Pensions.

Mr. Hill presented the petition of William A. Jarboe and 61 other citizens of Prince George's County, praying for a law to secure the better observance of the Sabbath.

Which was read and referred to Senators Hill, Gorman and Joyce.
