REPORT.

To the Honorable,

The Senate and House of Delegates :

GENTLEMEN :

The Committee of Conference on the disagreeing votes on the printed bill, No. 212, entitled an Act making appropriations for the support of the State Government for the fiscal year ending September 30th, 1879, respectfully report, that after a full and free conference they recommend that the Senate recede from its second, ninth and eleventh amendments, and that the House of Delegates concur in the fourth and eighth amendments of the Senate.

The Committee further recommend that the thirteenth amendment of the Senate be so modified as to appropriate the sum of forty-one thousand six hundred and ninety-six
