Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act to repeal Chapter 294, entitled "Mortgages," of the Acts of 1870, Section 2, Chapter 483, of the Act passed at January Session 1874, entitled "Revenue and Taxes," and Section 1, Chapter 260, of the Act passed at January Session 1876, entitled an Act to provide for the general assessment of property in this State, and to enact the following in lieu thereof.
