

maining quarter shall be paid to Allegany County for its general purposes, and where said offense has been committed outside of any incorporated city or town, one-half of said fine shall be paid to Allegany County for its general purposes.

173. GENERAL PENALTY. Any person violating the provisions of this Article for which no penalty, other than the suspension or revocation of a license or permit, is provided, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or to imprisonment for not more than two years in the House of Correction, or jail, or both fined and imprisoned.

174. CORPORATIONS AND PARTNERSHIPS. If any fine shall be imposed by any Court upon any individual who has obtained a license under the provisions of this Article for or on behalf of any corporation, partnership, or unincorporated association, the corporation, partnership, or unincorporated association shall also be liable for the payment of such fine; and in case the penalty carries with it imprisonment, that penalty shall be borne by the individual.

175. LOCAL PENALTIES. (a) ALLEGANY COUNTY. In Allegany County (1) any municipal corporation may impose penalties for the violation of ordinances passed for the regulation and control of licensees under this Article.

(2) Any person violating any provision of this Article, for which no other penalty is provided, shall upon conviction be subject to a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or to imprisonment for not exceeding one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

(b) HARFORD COUNTY. In Harford County, (1) the penalty for a violation of any provision of this Article, if not elsewhere specified, shall be a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or imprisonment in jail for one year, or both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

(2) In addition to such fine or imprisonment for the illegal sale or offer of sale, or possession, of intoxicating liquors, any such liquors seized by the Sheriff of Harford County, or any other police officer, after the conviction of the possessor thereof, shall be confiscated and delivered to the said Liquor Control Board, to be sold and the proceeds paid to the County Treasurer for the use of Harford County.

(c) QUEEN ANNE'S COUNTY. In Queen Anne's County, for any violation of the laws as to licensing the sale of alcoholic beverages, the penalty upon conviction shall be a fine of not
