

## CHAPTER 520.

(Senate Bill 245)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sections 796 and 797 of Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Washington County," sub-title "State's Attorney," as said sections were amended by Chapter 482 of the Acts of 1939, relating to the salary and expenses of the State's Attorney of Washington County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Sections 796 and 797 of Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Washington County," sub-title "State's Attorney," as said sections were amended by Chapter 482 of the Acts of 1939, be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

796. The State's Attorney for Washington County shall receive for the year 1947 and for each and every year thereafter an annual salary of twenty-five hundred dollars, to be levied and paid by the County Commissioners of said county, for the performance of the official duties of his office, said salary to be in lieu of all fees appearance and trial, and all other compensation for the same; provided however, that he shall be paid the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500.) per annum for expenses of his office; and also his actual expenses incurred in following and trying criminal cases removed from said county, shall be paid by said County Commissioners in addition to said salary.

797. The said salary of twenty-five hundred dollars per annum shall be paid to the said State's Attorney by the County Commissioners of said county, in equal monthly installments, and the said County Commissioners shall levy annually the said sum of twenty-five hundred dollars for the purpose of paying said salary to the said State's Attorney, and the said County Commissioners shall also levy annually the said sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500.) to be paid to the said State's Attorney for expenses of said office, and also a sum sufficient to meet the actual expenses incurred by the said State's Attorney in following and trying criminal cases removed from said county.
