- Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 7 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Health", sub-title "State Board of Health", be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:
- 7. The Deputy State Health Officers shall be trained in sanitary science and hygiene, and shall possess the same qualifications required of the State Health Officer, and shall hold their office during efficiency and good behavior, but may be removed for cause by a majority vote of the State Board of Health after having been given an opportunity to be heard in their own defense. No deputy State Health Officer shall practice medicine or engage in any other occupation which would conflict with the performance of his official duties. Each Deputy State Health Officer shall have an office located at some accessible point designated by the State Board of Health, within his sanitary district, and he shall receive such salary as shall be provided in the State Budget and shall also receive his expenses actually and necessarily incurred in the performance of his official duties.
- Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1947.

- 168. The said Commission shall have a Secretary to be appointed by it, who shall keep a full and true record of all
