1328A. For the period of each year from two A. M. on the last Sunday in April until two A. M. of the last Sunday in September, the County Commissioners of Prince George's County are authorized and empowered to fix, by ordinance or resolution, the official time of said county at one hour in advance of the standard time of the seventy-fifth meridian, which advance in said standard time is commonly called "Eastern Daylight Saving Time". If the County Commissioners so advance the official time of said county, all courts, public offices, legal and official proceedings, insofar as the same are subject to or under the control of said County Commissioners, shall be regulated thereby, and all time shown by the public clocks shall agree therewith.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and having been passed by a ye and nay vote, supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly of Maryland, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

 CHAPTER 316.

(House Bill 797)

AN ACT to add a new section to Montgomery County Code (1939 Edition), title "Montgomery County", to be under a new sub-title "Time" said new section to be known as Section 1130D, and to follow immediately after Section 1130C as said Section 1130C was added by Chapter 941 of the Acts of 1945, authorizing the County Commissioners to establish daylight-saving time as the official time in Montgomery County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That a new section be and it is hereby added to Montgomery County Code (1939 Edition), title "Montgomery County", to be under a new sub-title "Time", said new section to be known as Section 1130D, and to follow immediately after Section 1130C as said Section 1130C was added by Chapter 941 of the Acts of 1945, and to read as follows:
