88. **FREDERICK COUNTY.** In Frederick County notwithstanding any other provision of this sub-title, the privilege conferred by every class of "on sale" license may be exercised during the hours from 6 o'clock A. M. to 12 o'clock midnight, except on Sundays, when the hours shall be from 1 o'clock P. M. to 12 o'clock midnight. Provided, however, that nothing in this section shall apply to holders of Class E licenses.

89. **HARFORD COUNTY.** In Harford County, notwithstanding any other provision of this sub-title, licensees under this Article shall only sell, offer for sale, or dispense the beverages defined in this Article, between the hours of 7 o'clock A. M. and 12 o'clock midnight on week days and shall not sell such beverages during any other hours or at any time on Sundays. Nor shall said licensee conduct nor permit dancing on Sundays. No beer or light wine shall be permitted to be drunk on the premises of a licensee after fifteen (15) minutes following the closing hours prescribed in this section.

90. **HOWARD COUNTY.** In Howard County, notwithstanding any other provision of this sub-title, the opening hour on Sunday in the Fourth District thereof shall be 1 o'clock P. M. for the holder of a Class D Beer License (On Sale—Generally), and for the sale of beer by the holder of a Class D Beer, Wine and Liquor License (On Sale—Taverns).

No sale of wine or liquor shall be made in Howard County between the hours of 12 o'clock midnight on Saturday and 6 A. M. the following Monday.

91. **KENT COUNTY.** In Kent County, notwithstanding any other provision of this sub-title, it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or for any retail dealer to give alcoholic beverages between the hours of midnight on Saturday and 6 A. M. on Monday. Any person selling or any retail dealer giving alcoholic beverages in Kent County between the hours of midnight on Saturday and 6 A. M. on Monday shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the first offense, and for each succeeding offense shall be fined not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or imprisoned in the County Jail for not more than thirty (30) days or be both fined and imprisoned, in the discretion of the court.

92. **MONTGOMERY COUNTY.** In Montgomery County, notwithstanding any other provision of this sub-title, (a) a
