*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Postmaster General of the United States be and he is hereby requested to issue a commemorative stamp in recognition of "Brigadier-General Casimir Pulaski Memorial Day"; and be it further

*Resolved,* That the Secretary of State be and he is hereby directed to send, under the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, a copy of this resolution to the President of the United States and to the Postmaster General of the United States.

A Joint Resolution requesting the Congress of the United States to make available funds for the Chesapeake Bay Authority.

WHEREAS, Chapter 330 of the Acts of 1935 creates the Chesapeake Bay Authority for the construction of a bridge across the Chesapeake Bay; and

WHEREAS, State funds are not available for the construction of this bridge; and

WHEREAS, it is very important that the bridge be constructed for the convenience of the public generally; and
